

Order Amending or Resettling a prior Order or Judgment

Resettlement: This is used to correct an error or omission in the original signed order or judgment. It is to be used only in a case like a typographical error. It is not to be used to modify an existing order or judgment because of a change in circumstances (i.e. a new agreement)

Amendment: This is to be used to modify an existing order or judgment because of some sort of change in circumstances - like a new agreement between the parties or a further order by the court. Instead of doing a whole new amended judgment every time you change something - do an order making reference to the specific changes.

In each case, you must:

- Have the consent of the other party, (*stipulation between the parties*) or an order of the court authorizing the proposed amendment or resettlement. If not, you must bring on a motion before the court for that relief.**
- Submit an affidavit detailing the need for the amendment or resettlement.**
- Submit a copy of the order or judgment you are seeking to amend or settle.**
- Provide proof of consent from the other party.**
