**Six and one-half (6.5)** credit hours, of which 2.5 hours can be applied toward the area of professional practice requirement (family law), 2.5 hours toward the area of skills requirement, and 1.5 hours toward the area of ethics and professionalism requirement.

**Seven (7)** credit hours of which 4 hours can be applied toward the area of professional practice requirement (family law), 2 hours to the area of skills requirement, and 1 hour to the area of ethics and professionalism requirement.

Current Perspectives on Custody and Visitation - April 24, 2009

**Six and one-half (6.5)** credit hours, of which 3 hours can be applied toward the area of professional practice requirement (family law), 2.5 hours toward the area of skills requirement, and 1 hour toward the area of ethics and professionalism requirement

Law Guardian Update '09-10 - November 14, 2009

**Seven (7)** credit hours of which 3 hours can be applied toward the area of professional practice requirement (family law), 2 hours to the area of ethics and professionalism, and 2 hours to the area of skills.

Advocating for Children in Cases Involving Domestic Violence - January 2010

**Six (6)** credit hours, of which 2 hours can be applied toward the professional practice (family law) requirement, 2 hours toward the skills, requirement and 2 hours can be applied toward the professionalism and ethics requirement.

Critical Aspects in JD and Child Welfare Proceedings - April 23, 2010

**Six (6)** credit hours, of which 3 hours can be applied toward the area of professional practice requirement (criminal law), 2 hours toward the skills requirement, and 1 hour toward the area of ethics and professionalism requirement.

Children's Law Update '10-11 - November 13, 2010

**Seven (7)** credit hours of which 3 hours can be applied toward the area of professional practice requirement (family law), 2 hours to the area of ethics and professionalism, and 2 hours to the area of skills.
