The Gender Fairness Committee, New York County, Supreme Court, Civil Branch, is proud to feature a special presentation by **Mary Haviland**, a lawyer and community activist who brings more than 30 years of experience in violence against women, research, advocacy and philanthropy. In 2011, Ms. Haviland became Executive Director of the **New York City Alliance Against Sexual Assault**, an advocacy organization that advances training, research and community mobilization in order to sensitively respond to and prevent sexual assault.

Ms. Haviland began working with victims of domestic violence in 1978 at Brooklyn Legal Services, and served as the Director of the Park Slope Safe Homes Project for five years. Ms. Haviland was a founder and Co-Executive Director of CONNECT, a domestic violence organization, which focuses on early intervention and prevention as methods for ending family violence. She served as Deputy Director and a Commissioner of the NYS Office on Victim Services from 2010-11. Ms. Haviland has numerous publications and chaired several domestic violence task forces including a citywide committee on criminal justice and domestic violence as well as Mayor Bloomberg's Domestic Violence Advisory Board.
