

**The Suppression of Newspapers.**  
The United States Marshal, at Philadelphia has seized the packages of New-York *Daily News* sent to that city for sale, and also numerous other packages of the same paper, destined for Baltimore, Washington, Louisville, and other points in the South and West. The Marshal could not have known of anything peculiarly obnoxious to censure in that particular issue of the paper, for the packages were seized when the contents were yet unknown. Neither could the action of the Marshal have been without authority of the Government, for the peril of such an invasion of private rights would not have been willingly incurred. We are brought to the conclusion, therefore, that the *Daily News* is condemned, by reason of its general political tone, and that the Administration has resolved to prohibit its circulation in certain districts.
