Mediation and Negotiation: Serve as a volunteer mediator (third-party neutral) or negotiate with other parties on a client's behalf.

Can Volunteers Work Off Site: Yes.

Type of Work: Mediation; Negotiation.

Location, Days, and Hours of Volunteer Opportunity:
Volunteers must have their own space or office from which they can work.

Area of Substantive Law Required: Negotiation.

Supervision: VLA provides minimal supervision to its volunteers. VLA is available to answer questions by telephone or email and reaches out to volunteers periodically to receive updates and discuss developments in the case.

Training: VLA requires all volunteers to participate in an hour-long training to discuss the nature of the volunteer experience and VLA's operating guidelines for volunteers as well as VLA's supervisory role. VLA has a list of relevant legal resources on its website.

Time Commitment: Volunteers generally spend between 10 to 15 hours on a matter.

Previous Experience in Substantive Law Required: Yes.

Specific/Previous Training Required: Yes.
