QUALIFICATIONS: Bachelor's Degree from an accredited college or university and one (1) year of satisfactory full-time experience in social casework with a recognized public or private agency adhering to accepted professional standards; **OR** Credentialed Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Counselor (CASAC) and two (2) years of satisfactory full-time experience in social casework with a recognized public or private agency adhering to accepted professional standards; **OR** An equivalent combination of education and experience. *While these are minimum qualifications, consideration may be given to education and experience directly related to the assignment.*

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF WORK: Case Managers I report to the Chief Clerk and Project Director and work in problem solving parts and units. Case Managers I develop treatment plans, determine intervention services, counsel participants and make recommendations to the court. Case Managers I prepare written reports and maintain case files on participants. Case Managers I may also perform other related duties.

ASSIGNMENT: This position will be assigned primarily to the Monroe County Drug Treatment Court. However, the incumbent may be assigned to assist in any of the Drug Treatment Courts as needed. The incumbent will coordinate services among providers for the Courts; monitor compliance with dispositional plans, court mandated appointments and referrals; and monitor compliance with service providers' expectations and recommendations. The incumbent is expected to acquire resources and facilitate referrals. Participation in team meetings is required, along with appearing in court to inform the Judge of the defendant's progress. The Case Manager I will also conduct on-site urine screenings.

Experience with chemical dependency assessment and treatment, a general understanding of the criminal justice system and familiarity with drug treatment court operations is desirable. The Case Manager I must maintain accurate records, using the Universal Treatment Application. Strong computer and organizational skills are needed.

GENERAL INFORMATION: The above statements are intended to describe the general nature and level of work being performed by persons assigned to this title. They do not include all job duties performed by employees in the title, and every position does not necessarily require the same duties.
