

BIOGRAPHY OF JULIANA MAUGERI

Ms. Maugeri began her legal career in 1986 as a Law Clerk in the New York City Criminal Court after which she served as Confidential Law Secretary to then Acting Supreme Court Justice Karla Moskowitz. Thereafter, Ms. Maugeri was a staff attorney with the Criminal Appeals Bureau of the New York City Legal Aid Society. Ms. Maugeri relocated to Dutchess County and was employed for seven years as an Associate with the Poughkeepsie Law Firm VandeWater & VandeWater, specializing in media law, civil rights, and commercial litigation. Ms. Maugeri then returned to the court system as a Principal Court Attorney in the Law Department of the Appellate Division, Second Department.

From 2001 to 2008, Ms Maugeri served as Principal Court Attorney to then Appellate Division, First Department, Associate Justice George D. Marlow. Thereafter, Ms. Maugeri served as counsel to Justice Marlow in his capacity as Statewide Judicial Director of Ethics Education and Counsel while continuing to serve as his Principal Court Attorney in Supreme Court, Dutchess County until December 31, 2009. On January 4, 2010, Ms Maugeri began her new position as Court Attorney-Referee in Dutchess County Supreme Court and continues to serve as counsel to the New York State Advisory Committee on Judicial Ethics.

Ms. Maugeri is a member and past president of the Mid-Hudson Chapter of the New York State Women's Bar Association and is a member of the Dutchess County Bar Association. In 2009, Ms Maugeri was selected by the Appellate Division, Second Judicial Department, to serve as a member of the Law Guardian Advisory Committee for the Ninth Judicial District.

Ms. Maugeri graduated from SUNY @ Stony Brook in 1978. From 1982 to 1986, she attended the night program at Brooklyn Law School while working full time as a paralegal in the Litigation Bureau of the Office of the Attorney General of the State of New York. Upon receiving her JD in 1986, Ms. Maugeri was also bestowed the Stephen Jay Penzick Memorial Award, given to the graduating senior who attains the highest grade in the course of Administrative Law.
