

David J. Roman currently serves as an Oswego County Court Judge, filling an interim vacancy, through December 31, 2010. He presides over the Sex Offender Treatment Court program in Oswego County, and is cross-assigned as an acting Family Court Judge in both Onondaga and Oswego Counties. He also served as a Judicial Hearing Officer in the Onondaga County Family Court, in both 2009 and 2010, through the time of his nomination and confirmation as County Court Judge.

Judge Roman assumed the bench on January 1, 1989. He also presided over the Oswego County Family Treatment Court for seven years and was instrumental in its creation. In addition, he served as a full-time (acting) Supreme Court Justice, presiding over Oswego County's Integrated Domestic Violence Court from its inception in December, 2005 through the end of his term in 2008.

Among Judge Roman's professional activities, he has been a member of the NYS Advisory Committee on Judicial Ethics since 1996. He previously was an eighteen year member of the Fourth Department Law Guardian Advisory Committee and was an active member and two year past president of the NYS Family Court Judges' Association.

The Judge graduated from Albany Law School of Union University in 1976, and received his B.S. from Cornell University in 1973. He was admitted to practice in 1977, and, prior to his election in 1988, served as a confidential law clerk in both NYS Supreme and Family Courts. Judge Roman is a member of the American, New York and Oswego County Bar Associations, and served two years as President of the Oswego County Bar Assn. while in private practice.
