Internet Access Policies

The Appellate Division Law Library provides free access to information in a wide range of formats to meet its mission to “provide legal information to the Appellate Division, to the Rochester metropolitan region and to the entire legal community of the Fifth, Seventh and Eighth Judicial Districts.” Electronic resources, including the Internet, are available to supplement the library’s collection.

The following rules and limits apply to anyone using the Internet at the Appellate Law Library:

- The Internet is to be used solely and strictly for legal research. Usage will be monitored. Those wishing to use the Internet for email, chat rooms, entertainment, or general research should use their local public library.
- Use of the Internet for activities that violate local, state or federal laws is prohibited and could result in criminal prosecution.
- All users of electronic resources are responsible for obeying copyright laws as published in Title 17 of the United States Code when making copies.
- Use of the Internet is limited to 30 minutes if others are waiting.
- Tampering with, altering, editing or damaging any library computer hardware and/or software is prohibited.

Failure to comply with any of these rules will result in termination of Internet privileges and/or other library privileges, including access to the library.
