## MEMORANDUM

Re: Implementation of Mandatory Electronic Filing in Jefferson County Surrogate's Court

I am pleased to provide the Bar and other interested persons with an update on the progress of the New York State Courts' Electronic Filing System ("NYSCEF"). An expansion of the mandatory e-filing program has been proposed by the District Administrative Judge of the 5<sup>th</sup> Judicial District for Surrogate's Court in Jefferson County. To date, e-filing programs have been successful in the Supreme Court in Onondaga and Oneida Counties. Additionally, a mandatory program for e-filing in Oneida County Surrogate's Court began in July 2016, and a mandatory program for e-filing in Onondaga County Surrogate's Court is being proposed simultaneously with this Jefferson County proposal. There are currently 22 counties that have successfully implemented e-filing in Surrogate's Court; eleven of these counties have mandatory program in Jefferson County Surrogate's Court will be implemented in January 2017, for newly filed probate and administration proceedings and miscellaneous proceedings relating thereto.

The NYSCEF system is intuitive and easy to use, and the training program takes about two hours to complete. Training will be provided by the staff of the E-Filing Resource Center both on-line and on-site. Attorneys participating in the on-site sessions receive two CLE hours free of charge. In addition, counties that are new to mandatory e-filing may schedule and advertise their own training sessions.

Please note that Chapter 237 continues to provide an opt-out mechanism in mandatory e-filing cases for those attorneys who certify in good faith that they lack the requisite hardware, electronic connection or technical knowledge to participate in e-filing. However, Chapter 237 has changed the law so that unrepresented litigants are now automatically exempt from participating in e-filing and are no longer required to opt out.
