

Updated June 7, 2023: Temporary Changes to CLE Program Format Restrictions Extended through December 31, 2023

Changes to CLE Program Format Restrictions: The CLE Board continues to implement the following changes, effective March 11, 2020 through **December 31, 2023**:

- **Newly Admitted Attorneys:** Newly admitted attorneys (those admitted to the New York State Bar for two years or less) may participate in Skills CLE courses in the following live, nontraditional formats, where questions are allowed during the program:¹
 - a. webconference,
 - b. teleconference, and
 - c. videoconferenceby individual participation (self-study) or group participation.

- **New York State CLE Accredited Providers (Not Individual Course Providers):** NYS CLE Accredited Providers may offer CLE programs in the above-listed formats and the above-listed methods of participation, provided they do so in accordance with all applicable requirements set forth in the [*New York State CLE Program Rules and Regulations*](#).

¹ Under the [*New York State CLE Board Regulations & Guidelines*](#) (the “Regulations”), newly admitted attorneys are required to earn Skills CLE credits in a traditional live classroom setting or a fully interactive videoconference group setting.
