A: Non-Disabled Veteran Credits (5 points): DD214 (Report of Separation)—a legible photocopy of your DD214 (Report of Separation) which indicates that you have served full time active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States, other than active duty for training purposes, during one of the eligible periods as indicated on the application, and have been honorably discharged or discharged under honorable circumstances. If you are a current active duty member without a DD214, you should submit a copy of your most recent orders for conditional veteran credits consideration. Candidates granted conditional veteran credits must submit a DD214 within 30 days of separation from service.

B: Disabled Veteran Credits (10 points): 1) DD214 (Report of Separation); and 2) VA Summary of Benefits Letter— disabled veterans must submit documentation issued by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs indicating that you have a combined service connected disability rated at ten percent (10%) or greater. Acceptable documentation includes the most recent VA Summary of Benefits Letter or other written proof issued by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs.
