





Maintenance code violations

This portfolio has an average of **4.4** open HPD violations per residential unit. This is **worse** than the citywide average of 0.7 per residential unit. According to available HPD data, this portfolio has received **2779** total violations.

Evictions

In 2017, NYC Marshals scheduled 1 eviction across this portfolio. The building with the most evictions was 2409 SECOND AVENUE, MANHATTAN with 1 eviction that year.

Rent stabilization

This portfolio has also lost an estimated 145 rent stabilized units since 2007. This represents 72.5% of the total size of this portfolio. The building that has lost the most units is 464 EAST 115TH STREET, MANHATTAN, which has lost 19 units in the past 10 years.



1516 AMSTERDAM AVENUE, MANHATTAN currently has 114 open HPD violations - the most in this portfolio.





Structured Data

As we continue to disseminate how to import the data from NYC Open Data via API into Case Notes, we are working with advocates to determine which pieces of data they want to pull in as structured data that can reported upon.

DRIE/SCRIE Flags

Based on feedback from advocate focus groups, one of our next steps will be to determine if we can "flag" likely DRIE & SCRIE eligibility during intake regardless of case type.

Building Alert

We are exploring whether the capacity to rate the likelihood of problems w/in the building at as red, yellow or green light already exists in our community and can be leveraged without heavy new development.
