Electronic Document Delivery System

Created May 4, 2020

In Response to COVID-19 Public Health Emergency

Does not replace E-Filing

Delivery of a document via EDDS does not constitute service on any other party and is not considered "Filed" unless and until the court accepts it for Filing.

Available in over 320 non-Efile Courts

Over 1,700,000 documents have been sent via EDDS since May 2020

- 2. On Screen fillable forms & conversion to PDF for filing
- 3. Integration with present and Future DIY programs

Future NYSCEF developments

- ◆ Expansion in NYC Civil Court to additional case types Including consumer credit
- ♦ Implementation of e-filing programs in Appellate Term & Superior Criminal court
- ◆ Proposed Legislation to permit CAJ to authorize e-filing programs in all courts statewide including Justice and City Courts

VEC

Virtual Evidence Courtroom

Created to allow for easy submission of evidence electronically
Remote and In-Person Hearings
Currently only available for NYSCEF matters in Supreme Court
1000 VEC's created to date

Documents are submitted in an orderly way

Kept in a separate and secure area of NYSCEF

Not part of the Case Record

Not available for public view

Currently Available in Supreme Civil NYSCEF matters

Future VEC developments

◆ Updating VEC to accept any file type including audio and video

◆ Expanding use of VEC to courts not yet authorized to e-file

Future projects

- ◆ Testing of a new option that will allow an unrepresented party to submit a motion for fee waiver electronically.
- ◆ Creation and posting of additional video training modules for unrepresented individuals
- ♦ Expanding the use of Limited Notice of Appearances
 - ➤ Notice Terminating Limited Appearance
- ◆ Updating screens and forms to be more user-friendly and to be available in multiple languages
