Questions and Responses

The New York State Unified Court System (UCS) thanks the vendors that submitted the questions below concerning OCA-DGCP-065 Oneida County Firearm Youth Intervention Services, issued on December 1, 2025.

Below are responses to the questions UCS received in connection with this RFP.

Vendor # 1

Question:

Are indirect costs allowed in this project?

UCS Response:

An indirect rate of up to 15% is permitted. Indirect costs exceeding this amount requires a federally approved indirect cost rate agreement.

Question:

Do you have an estimate of the numbers of youth who are expected to be referred?

UCS Response:

The number of persons served in any given year will vary based on several factors, including the needs of the court, the volume of eligible participants, and the scope of intensity of services required. Applicants should propose a service model that is flexible and responsive to the varying needs and capacities.

Question:

Based on the past, can you provide a distribution of the communities were youth live?

UCS Response:

Youth must reside in Oneida County to be eligible.

Question:

Do you expect referrals to the project to be made weekly or monthly?

UCS Response:

Referrals are made daily.

Question:

On Page 5 of the RFP there is a reference to Onondaga County. Should that be Oneida County?

UCS Response:

This was an error. The correct reference is “Oneida County.”
