



NOTICE OF CREDIT CARD SERVICE FEE

Commencing April 1, 2021, and due to continuing budgetary concerns, the Unified Court System will no longer pay the service fee for credit card transactions initiated by court users. Consequently, **a service fee of 2.99% of the payment amount will be assessed on all credit card payments** submitted with electronically filed biennial Attorneys Registration fees.

Note that neither the Office of Court Administration nor the Unified Court System receives any portion of the service fee.

Payments may continue to be made without imposition of a service fee by check in **US dollars** drawn on a US bank, money order, bank draft drawn on a US bank, or traveler's check. Check payments must be submitted with a completed paper biennial registration form. Credit card payments will no longer be accepted with paper filings.

If you file electronically and use a credit card, there will be two transaction numbers generated, one for the biennial registration fee and one for the service fee.

The Court System is continuing to explore other technologies for electronic payments that minimize processing fees.
