HOW TO APPLY FOR POOR PERSON STATUS

New York Law recognizes that some persons may lack the financial resources needed to pay filing fees and court costs associated with a lawsuit. The law permits such person to apply to the court for an order designating the applicant as a <u>poor</u> <u>person</u> and relieving the person of the obligation to pay these fees, costs and expenses (although the filings must in any event be made). The applicant will not be allowed an exemption from the obligation to pay merely because he or she would rather not pay, or because his or her circumstances are difficult. Rather, the applicant must swear, upon pain of penalty or perjury, that he or she <u>is unable to proceed</u> in the absence of an order granting an exemption.

The applicant must prepare an affidavit supporting a request for poor person status sufficient to meet the standards set out in the law (specifically, Section 1101 of the Civil Practice Law and Rules). **Print or type using black ink only**. A form of poor person affidavit is attached. Details of the financial condition of the applicant is attached (income and property owned) must be set forth and those details must satisfy the court that an exemption from the obligation to pay is warranted. If the affidavit consists of generalities or if the showing is unsatisfactory, the request may be denied. Documentation of the figures provided to the court is required (e.g., pay stubs from an employer, social services budget letter).

Furthermore, the papers must satisfy the court that the case the applicant wishes to bring has some merit. The court may insist, as provided by CPLR 1101, that the applicant submit a certificate signed by an attorney admitted to practice law in New York stating that he or she has examined the applicant's case and finds that it has merit.

The applicant will also submit a proposed form of poor person order that the applicant wishes the Justice to sign. **Print or type using <u>black</u> ink only**. A form of such an order is attached.

The application should be presented to the General Clerk's Office room 217, along with the commencement papers, that is, the papers which will initiate the action, when the applicant is ready to purchase an Index Number. The Index Number is the number assigned to every action or proceeding commenced within the New York Supreme Court. The number is used to identify a case throughout the court system in that particular county.

The papers will be presented to a Justice of the court. A ruling on the request will issue in a few days after the papers in proper form are submitted.

If the request is granted, the poor person order will be filed by the court with the County Clerk.
