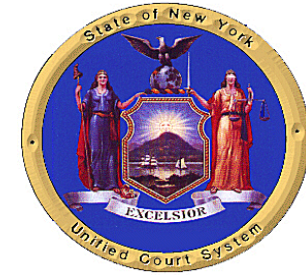

What is the Court Help Center?

The Eighth Judicial District Court Help Center employs staff to provide free procedural information to the public. They are neutral parties who **cannot give legal advice** or tell you the best way to handle your case.

Help Center Staff CAN provide information on:

- how to commence cases
- how to answer cases
- how to collect judgments
- filling out forms
- court procedure
- small claims cases
- referrals to appropriate agencies
- public access computer use
- how to find your destination court

Help Center Staff CANNOT:

- give legal advice
- provide information that should be entered on your form
- interpret statutes, cases, or opinions
- provide opinions about a judge, court employee or private attorney

Who is the Court Help Center for?

The Help Center is available to anyone who needs assistance:

- navigating the complex court system
- obtaining legal information or legal forms
- using a word processing program for preparing documents
- finding out the status of a case

What materials are available at the Help Center?

The Help Center will have a variety of written material and sample forms available on topics involving Civil, Supreme and County Courts including:

- Uncontested Divorces
- Name Changes
- Courts of New York
- Child Support Determining the Amount
- Small Claims

Does the Help Center have computers?
