

7 Not eligible if brickwork is covered by cement wash or other coating.

8 For skylights over 16 sq. ft. The maximum allowance for eligible skylights under 16 sq. ft. shall be 50% of allowance listed.

9 Not eligible without new or existing store windows.

10 Plus all other applicable partial allowance items listed.

11 For buildings over eight stories the approved quantity shall be equal to the actual quantity increased by 10% for each floor over eight.

12 Maximum of one per apartment unless the apartment has two or more bedrooms. This item is eligible as an A/C if new water main, riser, and branch piping is installed throughout and if new ceramic tile and at least two new bathroom fixtures are installed in at least 90% of the bedrooms.

13 Maximum of one per apartment.

14 For water service 3/4" in diameter or greater the approved length shall be equal to one and one-half times the actual installed length.

15 Oil, gas, or combination burner.

16 The waste heat from the cogeneration unit must be used for heating domestic hot water or space heating of the residential units.

17 The eligible length cannot exceed 8 feet in any apartment.

EXECUTIVE ORDER IMPOSING A CHARGE FOR PAYMENTS TO THE CITY BY CHECKS RETURNED FOR INSUFFICIENT FUNDS

By virtue of the power vested in me as Mayor of the City of New York, it is hereby ordered:

Section 1. Charge of Payment on Account of Insufficient Funds. Pursuant to section 85 of the General Municipal Law, a charge of fifteen dollars per check may be added to any account owing to the city of New York or any of its agencies where a tendered payment of such account was by a check or other written order that was returned for insufficient funds.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Order shall take

effect 30 days after publication in the City Record.

Report pursuant to Sections 24-316 and 24-320 of the Administrative Code of the City of New York with respect to (check number 90-126), a proposal for interior and exterior alterations to the former Palgrave Industrial Savings Bank (LP-1123) at 49-51 Chambers Street, Borough of Manhattan.

Honored Members and Sirs--

The Landmarks Preservation Commission has reviewed a proposal for interior and exterior alterations at the former Palgrave Industrial Savings Bank (LP-1123) at 49-51 Chambers Street, Borough of Manhattan. The proposal is for the Office of the Mayor to facilitate the relocation of the printing shop in the basement floor of the building. In accordance with Capital Budget No. FY 771451 Drawing DMT-1, A-1 thru A-7, S-1 and S-2, P-1, M-1 thru M-4, P-1, E-1 thru E-3, dated April 4, 1988 as prepared by Arthur L. Spack and Nelson, for the Department of General Services. The Landmarks Preservation Commission has determined that the interior alterations will not affect any of the protected architectural features within the designated interior areas of the building. The HVAC equipment and dry-cooler installation on the south roof over the former banking hall will have a sufficiently low profile, and will be adequately hidden by the sculptural parapet, therefore they will not be visible from ground level and will not adversely affect the protected architectural features of the buildings exterior. However, the Landmarks Preservation Commission is concerned about the portion of the proposal which will require that the eastern-most driveway on the West Street facade (27 West Street) be used as a means of delivering large quantities of paper and supplies for the print shop, and the threat this will create to the recently restored exterior bronze doors. A permanent in-place means of protection for these doors should be incorporated into the proposed relocation of the printing shop for the Office of the Mayor to the former Palgrave Industrial Savings Bank.
