I, MARTINE CHARLES-CATOR, affirm under the penalties of perjury that:

1. I am Chief Management Analyst for the Office of Court Administration Attorney Registration Unit ("OCA") and am responsible for, and oversee, the registration of attorneys admitted to the New York State Bar, including the OCA Attorney Services - Registration Database.

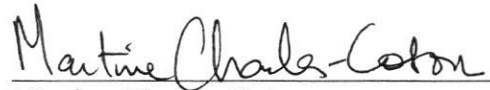
2. As Chief Management Analyst, I oversaw the compilation of a report of attorneys who have not re-registered with OCA during the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 biennial registration periods. The report included the names of those attorneys whose business address is in the Third Judicial Department or, if an attorney's last address was outside of New York State, whose department of admission was the Third Judicial Department.

3. In an effort to contact the attorneys listed in the report who were required to re-register for each biennial period, a first notice to re-register was sent to each attorney at either their email or home address immediately before the month of their birth.

4. A second notice was sent to each attorney's business address requesting registration compliance and a final notice was sent to each attorney's home address directing the attorney to register. Additionally, most of the attorneys listed in the report were mailed a Delinquent Notice detailing each past-due registration.

5. Despite the mailing of the above notices, the attorneys whose names are listed in **Exhibits "A", "B", and "C"** annexed to petitioner's current application, remain unregistered according to the records of OCA.

I affirm this 8th day of May, 2026, under the penalties of perjury under the laws of the State of New York, which may include a fine or imprisonment, that the foregoing is true, and I understand that this document may be filed in an action or proceeding in a court of law.
