**REVISED PUBLIC NOTICE**

The Independent Judicial Election Qualification Commissions (IJEQC) for the Second, Ninth, Tenth and Eleventh Judicial Districts, Second Judicial Department (see attached 2008 Vacancy List), is accepting Questionnaires for judicial candidates who wish to have their qualifications reviewed by a commission in the Second Judicial Department for public election to the Supreme Court, County Court, Surrogate's Court, Family Court, New York City Civil Court, District Courts and City Courts. The voluntary statewide screening process for evaluating judicial candidates was established in 2007 by the New York State Unified Court System.

An *original* and *fifteen* copies of the Questionnaire must be submitted to Vivian A. McCallum, Director, IJEQC, 335 Adams Street, Suite 2404, Brooklyn, NY 11201. Candidates may apply for IJEQC ratings at any time and should submit their completed Questionnaire as soon as they have made the decision to seek judicial office. Candidates who wish to have a Commission issue a rating prior to the September 9, 2008 primary election, are encouraged to submit the Questionnaire by June 8, 2008 to enable the Commission to have sufficient time to review their qualifications. However, if because of hardship or other sufficient reason, a candidate submits a Questionnaire within a sufficient period of time before the election, the Commission will make every effort to accommodate the candidate.
