

School 58 Mock Trial

The Appellate Division, Fourth Department sponsored a moot court competition June 9 for seventh grade students attending World of Inquiry School No. 58.

The Appellate Division established a partnership with the school last year in an effort to promote volunteer activities in the community. School 58 is an expeditionary learning school within walking distance of the Appellate Division courthouse. Instruction is project-based, involving students in field research, often with the support of professionals from the larger community.

In November, the 70 seventh grade students attending School 58 had the opportunity to tour the Appellate Division, meet judges, lawyers and staff, and observe oral arguments.

Five students returned in January for two days of intensive study. Those students sat on the bench with Presiding Justice Henry J. Scudder, heard arguments presented by Appellate Division law assistants and prepared a written decision. The program culminated with the first-ever middle school moot court competition held at the Appellate Division. Eleven students participated, arguing before a panel of three Appellate Division judges and a courtroom full of proud parents, friends and teachers.
