Appeal from a judgment of the Monroe County Court (Vincent M. Dinolfo, J.), rendered March 16, 2017. The judgment convicted defendant upon a jury verdict of attempted murder in the second degree, assault in the first degree and aggravated criminal contempt.

It is hereby ORDERED that the judgment so appealed from is unanimously affirmed.

Memorandum: On appeal from a judgment convicting him upon a jury verdict of, inter alia, attempted murder in the second degree (Penal Law §§ 110.00, 125.25 [1]), defendant contends that County Court erred in denying defense counsel's challenge for cause to a prospective juror. Defendant correctly concedes that the denial, even if error, would not require reversal because defense counsel exercised a peremptory challenge to excuse that prospective juror and did not thereafter exhaust defendant's peremptory challenges (see CPL 270.20 [2]) and, contrary to defendant's contention, "defense counsel's failure to exhaust all of the available peremptory challenges does not constitute ineffective assistance of counsel" (People v Printup, 278 AD2d 834, 835 [4th Dept 2000], Iv denied 96 NY2d 786 [2001]).
