



SSA Reporting on Arrests and Summonses

July 1, 2011 – June 30, 2012

GENERAL DATA

There were 2,548 arrests and summons – more than 11 per day – during the four quarters of the 2011-2012 school year. Including summer school, there were 216 high school days and 209 middle school days during this 12 month period.
